# PROTECT YOUR PHONE

If your mobile is stolen, it's bad enough that it's expensive to replace, but there's also the hassle of losing stored numbers, messages, pictures and downloads. So protect your phone!

**KEEP AN EYE OUT** for those around you – if you're chatting on your phone, remember to be aware of what's going on around you. Don't walk and text!

**DON'T** leave your phone on tables in pubs or restaurants.

**AVOID** using your phone near a tube or train station or when getting on or off the bus. Wait until you're further away from the stop or station.

**ALWAYS** ask yourself, "Is it safe to get my phone out now?"

# REGISTER, REPORT, REUNITE

**REGISTER** your phone for free with Immobilise or another secure personal property register organisation. This will allow the police to return your phone to you if it gets stolen. You can also register your phone details with your network.

If your phone is lost or stolen, **REPORT** it immediately to the police. *Call your network provider and ask them to **block the SIM card and handset**.* This will make it useless to the thief. For help reporting it to your network, call the **Immobilise helpline 08701 123 123**. We're cracking down on mobile phone thieves. This means we're more likely to recover your phone if it's stolen. If we do, and you've registered your phone, we can **REUNITE** you with your phone.

- If your phone is stolen:
  - report it to the police immediately
